AMCOM Campaign Plan highlights priorities

The newly minted AMCOM Campaign Plan (CAMPLAN) FY20-21 is out and available to AMCOM's workforce. The CAMPLAN is aligned and nested to the U.S. Army and U.S. Army Materiel Command's strategic direction and intent. The overall theme is "Improving Readiness Gains, Driving Future Sustainment."

The campaign plan outlines specific mission focuses for both FY20 and FY21, the command's strategic priorities and AMCOM's three lines of effort. AMCOM Commanding General Maj. Gen. Todd Royar remains committed to both AMCOM's people and Army readiness.

Recognizing the U.S. military began 13 of the past 18 years under a continuing resolution, a bipartisan conference committee put forward a final version of the Fiscal Year 2020 National Defense Authorization Act, signed by the President on Dec. 20.

The conference committee noted troops have long contended with wasteful and inefficient stopgap funding. The committee's report also

resource-constrained environment – we always have and always will," said Royar. "The simple fact is that we cannot do everything we would like to do to improve readiness. Consequently, this campaign plan acknowledges this fact and guides our strategic choices by setting priorities in terms of our lines of effort and the specific areas we want to attack over the next two years."

According to Royar, AMCOM has an immensely talented workforce, but also faces some challenges.

"AMCOM continually strives to maintain a culture that promotes the Army values, treats everyone with dignity and respect and provides opportunities for... [READ MORE](#)

noted the impact continuing resolutions combined with years of high op-tempo and inadequate budgets contributed to a fatal readiness crisis, making particular note that military aviation deaths hit a six-year high in 2018.

"Senior commanders and DOD leaders repeatedly testified to the Committee that while we have arrested the readiness crisis, we have not yet reached the readiness levels required,"

the House Armed Services Committee summary noted.

With efforts to continue addressing military aviation safety, the FY20 NDAA provides a nine-month extension and authorizes an additional \$3 million for the National Commission on Military Aviation... [READ MORE](#)

G4 AMCOM G-4 is launching a new online application to maximize the organization's government vehicle management on Redstone Arsenal. The virtual motor pool is scheduled to launch February 2020 on the AMCOM Command Information Portal in collaboration with AMCOM G-6. It will provide visibility of available motor pool resources across the AMCOM Headquarters, allowing individuals to then utilize vehicles across organizational lines when vehicles would otherwise not be in use. The virtual motor pool database will allow drivers to request/reserve vehicles both inside and outside of their organization. The intent of this initiative is to maximize the benefit the command receives from each vehicle and increase vehicle availability for employees to perform the mission.

Usery earns AMC 'Top Employee' recognition

An AMCOM logistics management specialist working on a Program Executive Office for Aviation project team to modernize the UH-60L Black Hawk is among Army Materiel Command's top third-quarter employees for fiscal 2019.

The recapitalization project aims to design and implement upgrades to the L model's decades-old analogue gauges and other operating systems.

Clayton Usery's most notable contribution to the team was supervising the development of Milestone C logistics documentation, which facilitated leader approval for low-rate initial production of the UH-60V.

"Milestone C is a huge package of supporting documentation that shows key decision makers not only how the new design will work, but also how we will support the upgraded UH-60V helicopter to keep it flying," he said.

Usery led the coordination of all UH-60V logistics milestone documentation to include the Life Cycle Sustainment Plan, Business Case Analysis and Core Depot Assessment. He served as a subject matter expert during the

creation, staffing and authorization of all milestone documents. He also led the effort to develop training for active duty Army and Reserve units receiving the UH-60V.

Usery's leadership on the UH-60V recapitalization project "will increase readiness and capability across the Army," Jeremy Bolton, acquisition logistics chief, Division B, noted in his nomination of Usery for AMC's Top Employee of the Quarter award.

Army selects AMCOM solution as single technical manual viewer

The Army selected a single viewer for more than 7,400 electronic technical manuals, choosing a solution developed by an AMCOM team.

The Interactive Authoring and Display Software, or IADS, will become the Army's single viewer for all electronic technical manuals, said Army Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics Lt. Gen. Duane Gamble.

Just as Adobe acts as a viewer for a PDF file, IADS is the viewer for the military standard compliant data that makes up the Army's technical manuals.

IADS is currently available as a desktop application, with plans to go across mobile devices.

In response to a shortage of hangar space at Fort Rucker's Shell Army Heliport, AMCOM provided a Large Area Maintenance-Aviation facility.

The fabric tension hangar, which was assembled and ready to use in December, adds 14.4 thousand square feet of enclosed space needed for maintaining UH-72 Lakota helicopters used to train Army aviators.
