AMCOM 101 Spring Conference Strengthens Army **Aviation Readiness**



Army Aviation leaders and sustainment experts from across the globe gathered at Redstone Arsenal April 15-16 for the AMCOM 101 Aviation FY25 Spring Conference, hosted by the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command. The two-day event, held at the Sparkman Center, focused on readiness, sustainment,

modernization, and collaboration across the aviation enterprise.

Maj. Gen. Lori L. Robinson, AMCOM Commanding General, opened the event with a comprehensive overview of the command's mission, capabilities, and impact. "This is an opportunity to understand what the different organizations of AMCOM do for the Army," said Robinson. "Our commitment is simple: if it's fielded in the force, we will sustain it."

AMCOM Honors Two Retirees During Team Redstone Ceremony



The U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command celebrated the distinguished careers of two longtime civilian leaders, William "Bill" Lee and Robert "Tim" King, during the Team Redstone Retirement Ceremony at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama on April 24, hosted by Maj. Gen. Lori Robinson.

The ceremony recognized over 127 years of combined service among the day's four honorees. Both Lee and King, AMCOM team members, were applauded for their impact across the Army enterprise and their steadfast dedication to the mission.

CORPUS CHRISTI ARMY DEPOT, Texas - Lt. Gen. Christopher O. Mohan, deputy commanding general and acting commander of U.S. Army Materiel Command, visited Corpus Christi Army Depot on April 3. Maj. Gen. Lori Robinson, commanding general of the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command accompanied him.

"I feel proud to be in a place where

people are passionate about producing goods to meet the warfighter needs and who bleed red, white, and blue." Mohan said.

The purpose of the visit was to observe the depot's advanced technologies and ongoing modernization

projects. CCAD commander, Col. Kevin Consedine-along with the deputy and chief operations officer, Rod Benson-and other subject matter experts highlighted the advantages of having a rotary-winged aircraft maintenance and remanufacturing facility for the military.

"We are the [military] service most connected with the American people, because, when the nation calls, they call the Army," said Mohan.

An important part of the Army's organic industrial base, CCAD is an AMC major subordinate command that strives to increase operational efficiency in sustainment missions and streamline maintenance procedures.

Targeting workforce investment, operational enhancements, and utilizing technology to maintain readiness are the main focuses of Mohan's strategic objectives, which integrate four areas of action. CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas – The Army Aviation Association of America convened the 19th Luther G. Jones Army Aviation Depot Forum at the American Bank Center February 11-12, 2025.

The two-day event centered on Army Aviation Maintenance and sustainment, including insights into government capabilities, the Corpus Christi Army Depot (CCAD), and the benefits for global industry clients and partnerships. The subject for this year was CCAD-Enabling Aviation in Contact.

The forum is dedicated in honor of Col. Luther Griffin Jones Jr., a former commander of CCAD and mayor of Corpus Christi, who served

in the U.S. Army during World War II from 1939 to 1945 and the Vietnam War from 1958 to 1973.

This event served as a platform to connect with Warfighters, enterprise, and industry, facilitating the exchange of feedback and an understanding of the requirements of Combat Aviation Brigades to achieve victory in the surge. Over a year ago, an aviation logistics officer with the 1st Theater Sustainment Command, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Codi Walker, brought forth a plan for an expeditionary engine shop in the U.S. Central Command area of responsibility.

This plan was pitched to the 1st TSC commander, Maj. Gen. Eric Shirley, by the Aviation Field Maintenance Directorate at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama. The plan was approved and would proceed as a threephase project.



Helming the project is the 1100th Theater Aviation Support Maintenance Group, a National Guard unit from Edgewood, Maryland, and the 1st TSC forward aviation pillar in theater.


