CW4 John D. Hudson assumed the duties as the Air Defense Branch Maintenance Officer assigned to the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command (AMCOM) in May 2022.

Hudson began his career in the U.S. Army in 2001 as a Patriot Missile Crewmember with 5th Battalion, 7th Air Defense Artillery Regiment, based in Hanau, Germany.

In 2009, he received his warrant officer appointment as an Air & Missile Defense System Technician. Hudson has held various positions at duty stations around the world, including serving as a Battery Maintenance Technician, Tactical Director, Battalion Readiness Officer and Support Operations Officer. His duty stations include Fort Sill, Oklahoma; Hanau, Germany; Fort Bliss, Texas; Incirlik,

Turkey; Bahrain; and Qatar.

At his most recent assignment, CW4 Hudson was the Support Operations officer in charge with 11th Air Defense Artillery Brigade, Fort Bliss, Texas.

CW4 Hudson's military education includes the Warrant Officer Advance Course, Contractor Officer Representative Course; and the Global Combat Support System-Army.
