AMCOM G-3/5 OPERATIONS, PLANS AND STRATEGY



The U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command G-3/5 Operations, Plans and Strategy provides AMCOM with situational awareness, command analysis and operational and acquisition-system integration and strategic planning. These efforts strengthen internal and external communications and provide improved operational fidelity and continuity — not only for the AMCOM Commander and command staff but across AMCOM.

G-3 HQ (Director, Deputy Director, Business Management Office and Special Projects Staffs):

This staff section plans and executes all financial, personnel, facility, property and other necessary administrative functions in support of the G-3 mission.

G-33 Current Operations:

Synchronizes and integrates internal and external communications to provide the AMCOM Commander with operational situation awareness.

G-3(R) Operational Readiness:

Provides world-class logistics assistance and support to the warfighter, through a highly technical and multisystem Logistics Assistance Representative workforce. Serves as a direct link between the AMCOM Commander and field units to assist in maintaining operational readiness.

Mission: Synchronizes and integrates AMCOM core competencies in support of the U.S. Army aviation and missile materiel and operational readiness.

G-3(M) Materiel Readiness and Continuing Airworthiness:

Serves as the functional proponent for the Army Aviation's continued airworthiness processes, information management and materiel readiness and reporting.

G-3(X) Command Assessment and Continuous Improvement:

Assess Army Aviation and Missile sustainment support operations to improve AMCOM's safety, quality, standardization process effectiveness.

G-35 Future Operations, Strategy and Concepts:

Inform, advice and prepare the Command on the functional synchronization and integration of strategy, future operations and plans, acquisition programs and processes and overall mission priorities for AMCOM.
