AMCOM G-8 RESOURCE MANAGEMENT



MISSION: AMCOM G-8 will deliver defensible and sustainable resourcing solutions that enable aviation and missile readiness for the Army while achieving exceptional stewardship and auditable outcomes.

The U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command G-8 develops and executes resource management solutions which enables the sustainment and readiness of the Army's aviation and missile systems. To accomplish this, AMCOM G-8 manages the command's total resource portfolio consisting of approximately \$4.6 billion of appropriated, reimbursable and Army Working Capital Funds (AWCF) and 7,824 manpower authorizations.

AMCOM G-8's strength lies in the talent, experience and dedication of its employees. AMCOM G-8 encourages innovative thinking, daring ideas, and bold solutions to maximize the efficient use of the command's resources. Experts in many diverse disciplines, AMCOM G-8 financial, cost analysis and force management professionals work cooperatively as an integrated team to support the Soldier by enabling aviation, missile, and calibration materiel readiness for the U.S. Army.

Mission Essential Functions:

- Plan, program, budget and execute financial and manpower resources that fully enable the Command's missions.
- Develop, interpret and ensure compliance with applicable acquisition, fiscal, accounting and manpower laws, regulations and policies.
- Lead the Command's Audit Readiness efforts to ensure all systems and processes are fully auditable in accordance with Congressional, Defense, and Army guidance.
- Manage the current and future manpower resources to maximize the efficiency and effectiveness of the Command's workforce.
- Provide accurate and timely cost analysis in support of numerous major weapon system acquisition programs.

- Comptroller
- Army Working Capital Fund Management
- Resource & Acquisition Support
